

Downtown Development Authority of Augusta Board Meeting Minutes August 17, 2023

The Downtown Development Authority held its monthly meeting on August 17, 2023, at 10am at the Georgia Power offices, located at 1 10th Street, Suite 430.

DDA board members and staff in attendance were Chairman Jack Evans (via call-in), Vice-Chairman James Heffner, Secretary-Treasurer Stephen King, Phuong Nguyen, Pastor Anthony Booker, Executive Director Margaret Woodard, Project Coordinator Katherine Bonner, Consultant Tara Wood, and Legal Counsel Jeb Murray. Also in attendance were Ryan Mahoney from Parlay, LLC; HB Brantley from the Augusta Coliseum Authority; Jim Plunkett from Plunkett, Hamilton, Manton & Graves, LLP; Chuck Branch from NextSite (via Zoom); and John Clarke from The Augusta Press.

Vice-Chairman Heffner called the meeting to order at 10:00am. He thanked Mr. King and Georgia Power for hosting and welcomed guests.

Mr. King introduced the consent agenda, which included the May 2023 special called meeting minutes and May, June, and July 2023 financial reports. There were no questions or comments. Mr. Evans made a motion to approve the consent agenda, with a second by Pastor Booker, and the motion passed unanimously.
